



Pharmacists and Pharmacies working hard to contribute to COVID-19 Vaccinations

Saskatchewan residents are reaching out to pharmacies in growing numbers as the provincial second dose strategy has been announced and begun.

“Never before have pharmacies contributed so much to such a critical public health initiative. We are proud to do so and only ask for the public’s patience as we navigate overwhelming public interest and a much tighter supply of vaccination doses,” says Monique Zwack, a pharmacist and Chair of the Pharmacy Association of Saskatchewan Board of Directors.

Vaccine doses are expected to become more available through pharmacies as supplies ramp up over the next month. Patients should wait for their age category to be announced before calling pharmacies as pharmacies have to follow the provincial age category and priority structure. Patients are *only* able to book an appointment when they become age eligible.

Zwack went on to implore, “Please make sure you are cancelling any duplicate appointments you may have so other people can take that appointment, and we don’t waste any vaccines.”
